REPORT OF 2020 PLE EXAMINATION RESULTS FOR PAKWACH DISTRICT LOCAL GOVERNMENT.

1. Number of Registered candidates

Table 1: Number of registered candidates in the year 2020 and 2019.

A total of 1,708 candidates from forty eight (48) centres/schools were registered for the 2020 P.LE examination compared to 1,659 candidates in the year 2019. Take note of the following.

- All the forty eight (48) centres/schools were beneficiaries of the Government's free Universal Primary Education (UPE). Note that the few private schools sat under the UPE Examinations Centres meaning there were a handful of privately sponsored pupils.
- According to table 1 the number of candidates who sat in the year 2020 increased by 49 or 2.95% from 1,659 in 2019.
- The total number of candidates registered consisted of one thousand one hundred and twelve (1,112) or 65% boys and five hundred ninety six (596) or 35% girls. *This shows that the number of girls that completed primary school is wanting and is a cause of concern in Pakwach district.-*

Table 3 shows that overall performance by division one by sub counties in the urban or peri-urban areas of Pakwach Town council and Greater Panyimur Town while in rural sub counties performance was relatively poor. The relatively better performance in urban areas is attributed to high involvement of parent's in activities of teaching and learning of their children, which is lacking or fewer parents in rural areas care about.

4. Overall performance by Division

- Cumulative number of candidates who passed this examination in Division one were 9 girls and 33 boys giving a total of 42 or 2.46%, Division two had 673 candidates, Division three had 497 candidates, Division Four had 317 candidates, Division U had 122 candidates and Division X had 57 candidates as shown in table 1.
- Therefore the passed rate in the PLE of 2020 was 1,529 (89.5%) compared to 1,541 (93.3%) candidates who passed in 2019. This is 4.4% slight decrease in number of pupils who have qualified to proceed to post primary Education under Universal Post Primary Education and Training (UPPET).
- NB: Any candidate who scores division one or two or three or four is considered to have passed the examination and qualifies for post Primary Education under Government sponsorship. A candidate who scores division U is considered to have unsatisfactory results and may proceed for post Primary Education under private sponsorship and a pupil in division X is one who missed Examinations.
